In the time since they've been matched, Jim has seen a positive difference in Brandon. "We talk a lot about school, studying, and keeping organized. By the second half of this past school year, Brandon's grades had improved significantly. Another positive change I've noticed, is that Brandon has been showing more gratitude toward others – even the waiters and waitresses when we eat out," said Jim.

Jim also shared how becoming a Big Brother has had a positive impact on his life. "Being a Big has brought me laughter, friendship, and gratitude. Brandon has taught me that just being there for someone, even if you don't have anything profound to say, it is important."

Brandon shared how having Jim as his Big Brother has helped him. "I appreciate that my Big Brother Jim is helpful, kind and considerate. He has helped me find solutions to problems I have had. Our conversations about school and the benefits of studying and being organized were very meaningful and helped me to improve my grades.

Jim was asked what advice he would share with someone who is considering becoming a Big Brother or Big Sister. Jim responded, "I would tell them that the reason I applied to become a mentor in the program was to help a young person grow, what I didn't realize was that I'd be growing too. It has never felt like a burden or a chore. It has been a true joy for me to be a Big.
